Field Notes

In the early morning light, I walked groggily into the Hastings High School to assist with Joe Beattie's zero-hour Field Biology Class. Glancing up I observed three Common Loons flying overhead. As I paused to cherish the moment, I was struck with great appreciation that my life path has resulted in the ability to identify wildlife. I was also filled with awe and gratitude for how much we now know about loons and their conservation. We know that loons arrive on their territories within days of ice out, which likely meant those three birds were heading further north than Hastings. We also know young loons migrate to the ocean and typically only return to breed around seven years of age. We know these icons of the northland face many challenges, from oil spills to lead poisoning, and habitat loss. We know all this because we stand on the shoulders of those who have gone before us and their dedication to researching, sharing, and conserving our natural world.

At CNC I am reminded daily of the foresight, dedication and generosity exhibited by our predecessors and by today's friends, patrons, and volunteers. From Tom and Edna Carpenter's legacy in leaving their scenic estate for future generations to enjoy, to the volunteer who rushes in to clean the turtle tanks at the end of a long day grading college papers, I am constantly in awe of all you do to help CNC serve our communities. We accomplish more as a team than any one of us could alone.

CNC's magical Wisconsin Campus is a perfect example of shared vision and collaboration. In an abbreviated history: Al and Laurie Hein wished to protect their property into perpetuity, and Dan and Jean Greenwald helped accomplish the vision by collaborating with CNC and founding the Wisconsin Campus. Through the years the entire community has helped by donating time, treasure, and talent. Neighbors, the Wisconsin DNR, the Town of Troy, and others helped buy and

protect additional land. Today, the 300-acre site is easily accessible, nestled just miles south of I-94. To fully appreciate the magic of this place, close your eves and visualize driving along I-94 with the semis and commuter traffic whizzing past your vehicle. Turn south onto Carmichael Road and you are in the middle of traffic lights and strip malls. Barely a mile south on Carmichael, the road transforms into bucolic County Road F, bordered by trees and farms. Turn west onto East Cove Road, and you can physically feel the weight of the day lift away. On either side of the road, golden prairie grasses wave in the spring breeze. Northern Harriers swoop low in graceful arcs quartering the land hunting for voles. In the distance, aged oak trees spread broad branches providing shelter. Neighbors walk the prairie trails, stopping on a rise to contemplate the many feet that have traversed the vast prairie in centuries past.

The amazing things the CNC team accomplishes today is due to the many heroes that have gone before us, and those champions that share the journey with us today.



Evening Hike on the Wisconsin Prairie


