# Field Notes By Jen Vieth

As CNC starts a new chapter with two dynamic visitors' centers in two states, this week has, coincidentally, also been the end of an era. The large Cottonwood that supported the massive eagle nest on CNC's flood plain finally gave way. Fortunately for the feathered family, by the time the nest fell, the eaglets had fledged. It's not abnormal for trees to break under the weight of bird nests. Bald Eagles add sticks to their nests annually, making them larger and heavier. The world-record eagle nests in Florida and Ohio were 10 feet wide, 20 feet tall, and weighed more than two tons! Wonder what other objects weigh two tons? An adult White Rhino, or two male Bison, or a Dodge Charger.

The same week the eagle nest was lost, CNC hosted an international teacher's workshop, which was coordinated by the University of Minnesota and the US Forest Service. Educators from throughout the hemisphere spent three days in the Twin Cities learning about birds and bird education. CNC was selected as a site because we are home to two Motus Towers, one in Minnesota and the newest one in Wisconsin. The towers both have dual listening capabilities (166.38 MGHz Lotek Nano Tags and CTT 434.0 MHz LifeTags) and have been successfully "listening" for tag signals since 2020. The first year, our MN tower picked up three Swainson's Thrushes tagged near Whistler, British Columbia, Canada and also one Least Flycatcher tagged by the National Resources Research Institute in NE Minnesota. In 2021, the tower picked up a Virginia Rail on spring migration from a Forbes Biological Station tagging project in Chad, Illinois, and another Virginia Rail from that project was picked up in May 2022. The tower also picked up a few American Kestrels during 2020 and

2021 that were tagged at Arden Hills (AHATS), Sax Zim Bog, and one female that was tagged at CNC. We are honored to be part of this international research.

This new technology allows us to learn more about a bird's full life cycle. Sharing information about bird banding, satellite telemetry, GPS geo-locators and nano-tags all which help with global bird conservation. As many bird species are declining, it's Increasingly important to pinpoint and protect the key habitats each species needs to survive, including nesting grounds, migratory stop-overs, and wintering grounds. The results the Motus project yields help researchers around the continent. Our birds cross national and international borders. When it comes to birds, we really are one world. Our birds connect us. And they depend on us. There's still much to learn and much to do to protect our feathered friends. From conserving habitat to planting native species to turning lights out during fall migration, there are large and small things each of us can do to help.


